 the County of Bedf<sup>r</sup>d I communing with my self in body but of good effect mindes thought be-  
 given to God) do make & ordaine this my last will & testament in manner & forme following  
 That is to say, first I command my soule into the hande of God my maker houldynge assuredly  
 through the only mediate of Jesus Christ my Saviour to be made partaker of his everlasting  
 & I command my bodie to the earth whereof it was made to be decently buried at the discretion  
 of my Executrix hereafter named Item I give & bequeath to my sonne iiddowes of  
 the towne parish of Luton aforesaid twelue pounds a piece the summe to be distributed  
 imediately after my decess, & to such iiddowers as my Executrix shall think due to have  
 most neede of relief Item I give grants Debts & bequeath unto my sonne Thomas  
 Marsum all my Messengers Lande & hereditarie in Luton a bounde & elsewhere  
 within the bounde walke of England. To have & to hold the said Messengers lande bounde  
 & hereditarie untille & smoulde therapperte unto my sonne Thomas Marsum  
 & to his heires for ever Item I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Marsum my eldest daughter  
 the summe of one hundred poundes of currant English money to be paid unto her or  
 her assignes by my Executrix hereafter named in and upon the day & effect of the  
 annuntiation of our blessed Ladie the Virgin Mary w<sup>t</sup> shall be in the yere of our Lord  
 God after the Concupition of the Church of England One Six hundred fiftie  
 & six yeare upon the day & celebration of the mariage of the said Elizabeth  
 Marsum w<sup>t</sup> of them shall first happen to come to passe after my decess Item I give  
 & bequeath unto Marie Marsum my youngest daughter the summe of one hundred poundes  
 of currant English money to be paid unto her or her assignes by my Executrix hereafter  
 named in and upon the day & effect of the annuntiation of our blessed Ladie the Virgin  
 Mary w<sup>t</sup> shall be in the yere of our Lord God after the Concupition of the Church  
 of England One thousand six hundred fiftie & six And I will that if either of my  
 said Daughters das ire & departe this life before the time limited for the payement of the  
 hundred pounde said given to her as aforesaid that then the portion of her said Due shall  
 remaine & be to the Embitome of my said Daughters, & I do will give & bequeath unto  
 my brother Jacob Marsum of Luton in the County of Bedf<sup>r</sup>d I communing & had  
 pounde of currant English money, And I do give & bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth  
 Edes now wife of Richard Edes of the tithid of London for the shillinge of currant  
 English money the said Leavies to my said brother & sister to be paid imediately  
 after my decess. And my will & meaning is that the sevall hundred poundes given  
 to my said daughters Elizabeth & Marie as aforesaid, And all other Leavies here by  
 me given shall imediately after my decess be raised & had by my Executrix here-  
 after named out of the monies wares vnde debt & household stuffe that shall be possessed
