 after after my death & also my funeral expenses & charges and the legacy in this my will & for doing
 and I do hereby Nominate & appoint Ann my said wife and my said son Matthew Executors of this my
 last will & Testament and doe hereby revoke & make void all former & other wills by me heretofore made & made
 of this execution of this my will I do Nominate & appoint my Executors in Law James Harding & Richard In
 witness whereof at the City of London the 10th day of the month of June 1670 I have sett my hand and sealed this
