

Gutteridge his heirs and Assignes for Ever Item I Give and bequeath unto my said Son William Gutteridge the Sum of One hundred pounds of Lawfull money of Great Britain to be paid unto him at his Age of One and Twenty Years by my Executrix or Executors herein Named out of my Personal Estate Item my will is and I doo Appoint that my Executors do carry on, Manage and Employ in and with the Tanning Trade, the Tannery yard in Luton aforesaid which I hold by Lease of Mr Daniel Punter, until my Son Joseph Gutteridge shall attaine his Age of One and Twenty Years if he shall so long live. And I doo hereby now Give unto him the said Stake in the Tanning Trade, But doo Appoint the said Stake to be valued, when my said Son Joseph shall have attained his said Age & Appraised by Two Indifferent Persons, Understanding in the said Trade, And if the same Stake (or sure Valuation as aforesaid) shall fall short of amounting to the Sum of Three hundred pounds in such case I doo Give unto my said Son Joseph such further Sum and Sums of Money out of my Personal Estate as shall fully make up such Deficiency (But if it Amount to more than Three hundred pounds I doo will and Appoint my said Son Joseph to pay such Overplus to my Executors for the purposes in this my Will contained) Item I doo Give and bequeath unto my said Youngest Son James Gutteridge the Sum of Two hundred pounds of Lawfull money of Great Britain to be paid unto him at his Age of One and Twenty Years out of my Personal Estate Item I Give and bequeath unto my Sons Matthew and Richard Gutteridge, and to my Daughter Deborah Smith wife of Thomas Smith (my three Children by my former wife) the several Sums of Thirty pounds a peece, to be paid unto them respectively within Twelve Months next after my Decease Upon this Condition that they and every of them doo respectively Release and discharge my Executors (Some time before the time mentioned for the Payment of the said last Named Legacies) of and from all such Sum and Sums of Money and Legacies respectively Given to them in and by the Self Will and Testament of their late Grandfather Richard Gutteridge Deceased (I having already sufficiently Assigned the same as also given to each of them sufficient portions upon their respective Marriages) And my Will is that in case the said Matthew, Richard, and Deborah (my said Children) shall
