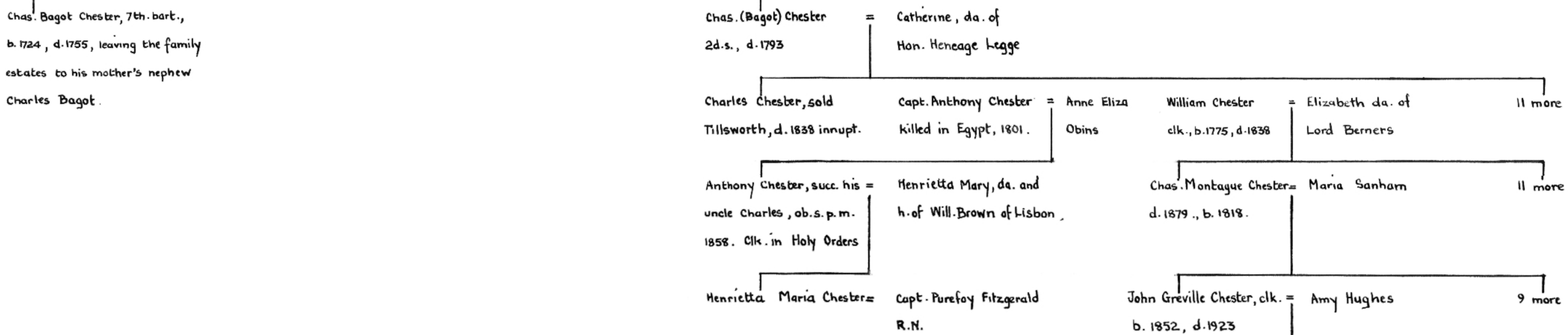
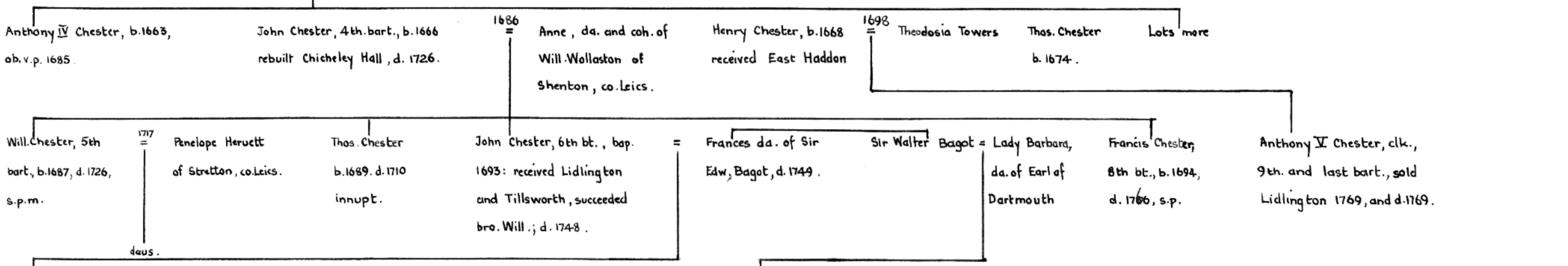
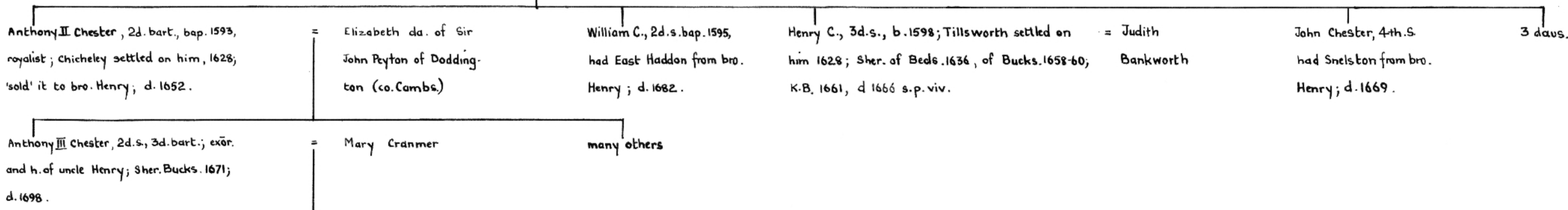
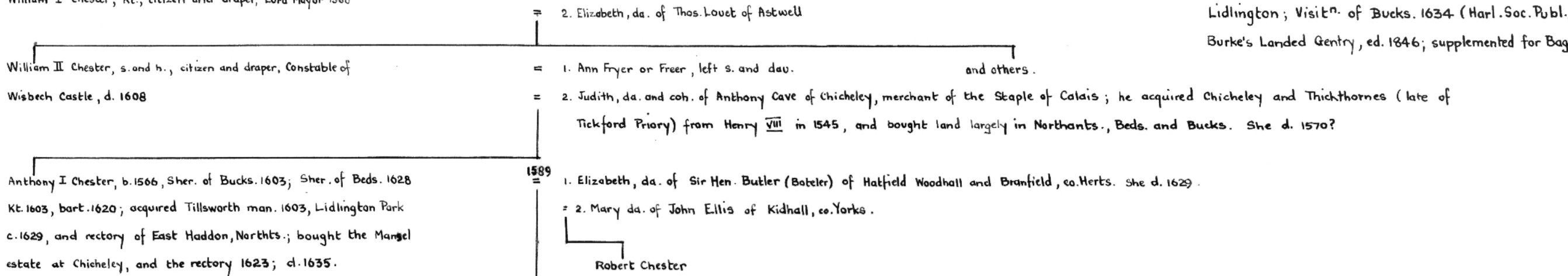


William I Chester, Kt., citizen and draper, Lord Mayor 1560
